John showed exceptional skills in turning a hat to a very thin tolerance, and Katherine showed us her creative skills with paints and pyrography. Thanks John and Katherine for teaching us these skills and for your time and efforts.



On Thursday 12th July we had a visit from our local member, Susan Templeman. We had invited her so that she could see how we were going with our Armistice Centenary Project. She spent about one hour with us looking at plans, models and posts being turned. She left suitably impressed. Thanks to all who are working on this project. You are doing a great job. We have had approval from Blue Mountains City Council for a heavy-duty air conditioner to be installed into the machine room and it hopefully should be installed before our next meeting.

At the meeting on Saturday I picked up three blanks to have a go at turning poppies for the Armistice Day project. I have turned 15 poppies from the three blanks (one was a long piece). Hopefully I have remembered all the verbal changes, and not missed any in the meetings I have missed:

- No need for pretty finishing and a bit rough is OK
- Plain bowl inside - no need for the lump in the sketch
- Base 20mm x 15mm

I also have not done any petals yet - I have a bandsaw and could easily do petals if I had a photo of the preferred petal shape.

So the crunch is that I am prepared to do more, but can't get down to the Thursday sessions to pick up more wood. My thought was that someone else from up this way might be able to drop some blanks off, or that I could arrange to meet someone at the Lawson Shed?

There is no rush as I will be away for the next week. I am not sure how many more I could do, but I would hope that I could maintain a steady rate in odd spare moments over the next few months.

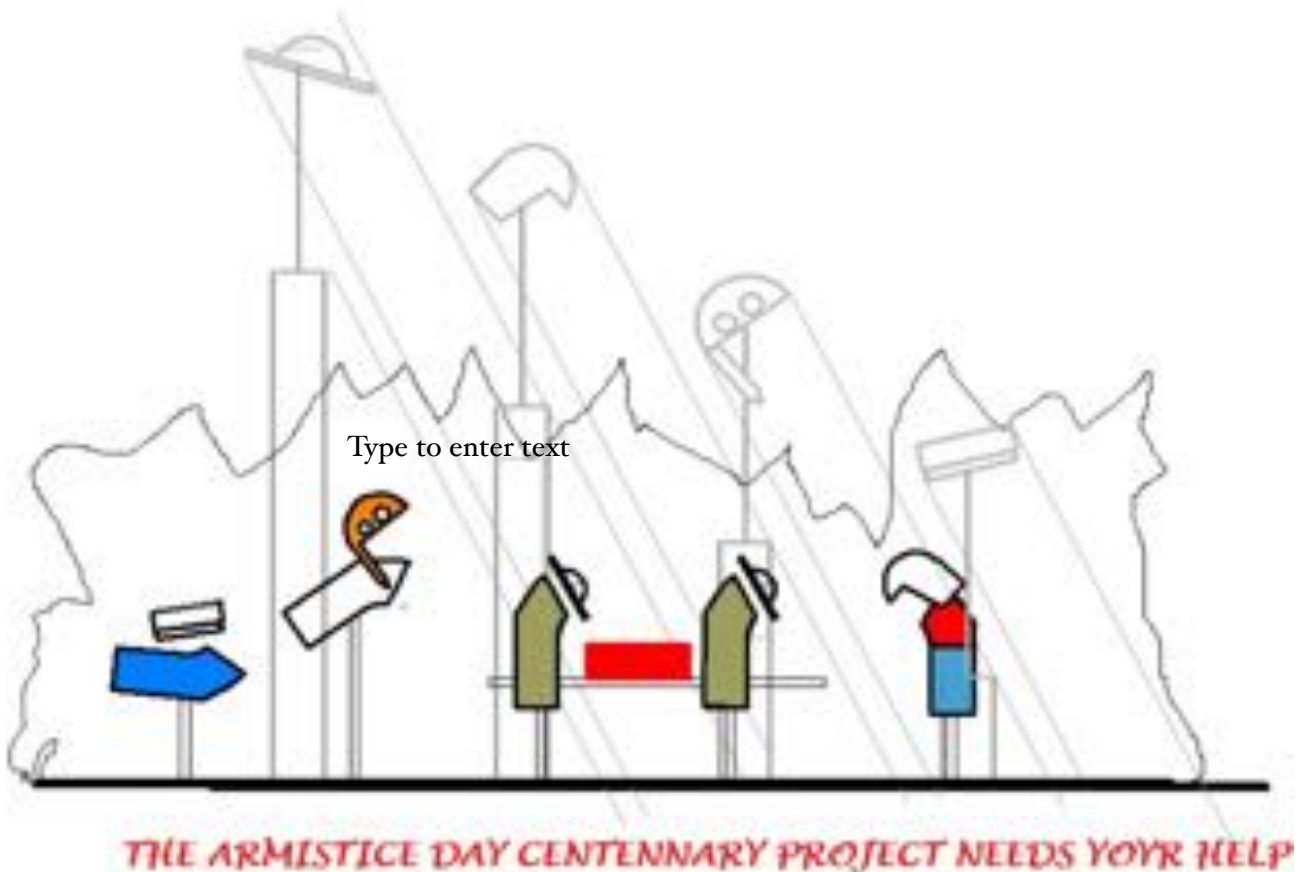
