He brought up some koala pictures on his computer and off he went. Derek made the koala head with no measurements by rule or callipers, only aligning by eye. It was disappointing that only about 8 out of the 26 members who said they were coming from our Club turned up to see Derek's amazing demonstration. Those that weren't there missed a fascinating time.
